

I would like to extend my appreciation to the Coromandel Valley Community Centre Board for the opportunity for Thalassa Ward councillors to report to the community on our activities over the past 12 months at their 2025 AGM. Cr Themeliotis and I work together representing residents in this ward and all those of the City of Onkaparinga. Thalassa Ward comprises of the suburbs of Coromandel Valley, Coromandel East, Ironbank, Cherry Gardens, Dorset Vale, Clarendon. Chandlers Hill, Aberfoyle Park and Flagstaff Hill and has a strong mixture of both metropolitan and rural areas.

The Coromandel Valley Community Centre plays a very important role in our local community attracting people from both sides of the creek with residents attending and enjoying the opportunities it offers, including playgroups, arranged visits to places of interest across Adelaide, Art Sessions, Connection Mediation-Sound Healing Circle, the Coro Connections Book Club, the Coromandel Valley Quilters and even the Men's Breakfast that I am a regular attendee of (just to mention a few). These activities help to bring a broad range of people together of all ages, enhancing their quality of life. As ward councillors we both attended the recent volunteer recognition evening dinner at the Community Centre to acknowledge the important contribution our volunteers make. I am aware of the



time commitment for volunteers, as I am one with the South Australia Police (role player/Neighbourhood Watch), Operations Flinders Foundation and the National Four-Wheel Drive HF radio network -VKS737, however my Council commitments do impact on the time I have available to do this so I understand the need to balance one's commitments.

The Community Centre's programs and facilities rely on the Board for strategic direction (with our Community Development Officer) and the volunteers who help to deliver these programs. I would like to recognise everyone for their important contribution in achieving them and supporting our community. I encourage residents to consider volunteering if they are not already doing so.

There were also those broader events held (including the Movie in the Park, ANZAC Day service and the Tour Downunder BBQ this year. The Tour Downunder BBQ was a lovely opportunity for me to participate with our volunteers in tossing sausages on the BBQ and mixing with our volunteers and visitors.

ANZAC Day is an important event, bringing everyone together recognising our return armed services men and women. Although I did not officiate at this year's Coromandel Valley service, I dropped in on my way from representing the City of Onkaparinga at the Cherry Gardens service and to do the same at the Clarendon service afterwards. Both Ct Themeliotis and I had also attended the ANZAC Youth Vigil (held at Morphett Vale the evening before with other councillors and members of parliament) and we both attended the dawn service held by the Flagstaff Hill Scout Group at Flagstaff Hill.

Cr Themeliotis and I have both worked closely with the Board on a broad range of governance, funding and upgrade issues, as well as engaging with residents regarding road safety upgrades along Main Road, Coromandel Valley. I made a point of attending the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) community consultation evening that was held at the Community Centre in April to gain a more comprehensive understanding by speak with the facilitators and attendees.

Last year I also attended a meeting that the Member for Waite arranged in the vicinity of The Walk with residents and then later one with the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport at the Coromandel Valley Shopping Centre. With Cr Themeliotis I attended an on-site meeting with council staff and residents at The Walk and Main Road discussing the issues further. Our Mayor, Moira Were, has since written to the Minister and the Member for Waite regarding these issues and staff from the City of Onkaparinga are working with DIT staff regarding these issues.

When talking about connecting with our community I attended all the Community Disaster Resilience sessions held at the Community Centre held to inform our community of the emergency risks/hazards in our area and how to prepare for them and reduce the impact on their lives. Community safety and resilience are issues that have played

a major part of my working life and continues as an elected member. The key messages are "Prevention, Preparedness, Response and Recovery".



Cr Themeliotis and I attend the Community Centre's board meetings in our nominated elected member liaison roles. This is a role that I undertake for 34 organisations across the City of Onkaparinga (around double to most of my fellow councillors), including many groups outside Thalassa Ward. Some I share with my co-councillor (and other councillors) and others on my own Those groups, I undertake this role for that cover the broader Onkaparinga area, include Health Cities Onkaparinga/Onkaparinga Food Security Collaborative, Onkaparinga Prostate Cancer Support Group, Southern Districts Baseball Club, various Neighbourhood Watch Groups, Morphett Vale RSL and the Noore Mosque at Morphett Vale. I am a state council member for Neighbourhood Watch SA and attend the Southern Adelaide Police District Neighbourhood Watch committee meetings again demonstrating my many years of commitment to community safety following my 42 years of policing in the South Australia Police/Australian Federal Polic.

In the past year I have attended all our Citizenship Ceremonies, currently being held at the Port Noarlunga Arts Centre this year whilst the Hopgood Theatre is being renovated) and since being elected to Council in 2018 have only missed 2 such ceremonies as I consider these events as one of our most important civic events. Each year I have sat on Council's Australia Day Awards Committee and all the Community Grants Assessment/Event

Activation Panels when they have been held.

I often have people ask me about the time commitment for being a councillor in the largest Council in the state by population - which require a lot of commitment. For the 2024/25 financial years it required me to spend 604 hours at Council and community meetings/events and 400 plus hours in preparing for meetings, dealing with resident issues etc and I drove 6,555 kms to attending meetings, ceremonies and events across our whole area.
